It's a great representation of putting the athletes in the spotlight, allowing them to perform, and giving them well-deserved cheers."

Both Karren and Alldridge were asked what excites them about serving on the Board of Directors. Dan responded, "I have had a great few years on the Special Olympics Utah Board. While I've

Dan stated, "The biggest goal from an event perspective would be having a full-fledged winter sports program return because we are a sports organization. However, the more meaningful accomplishment would be to help accelerate our athlete leadership program.

This organization was established for athletes, and we've been moving into a phase of an organization being run with athletes, yet I'd love to see the day when we have an organization run by athletes for athletes. Our job as the Board is to understand what the athletes need regarding support and how we can best equip them with the tools to succeed. Kyle echoed Dan's thoughts, stating he "would like to have the board take on the challenge of having SOUT athletes treated more like players of their sport instead of athletes with intellectual disabilities.
